When you lay your head to sleep tonight, pray for them to be safe in their fight. Message From Our Chief Range Safety Officer -

Range enhancements:

You no doubt have already seen the new steel baffles that DCGC has installed. This was a long time planned project to help ensure no rounds left the range and left the property. With new construction occurring a mile or less behind our range, this was a serious concern.

Sometime after the first of the year, DCGC will be closing the public range in order to resolve long standing drainage issues between the 75 and 100 yard line. As you know after heavy rains we end up with a swamp there that takes several days to drain. We will regrade the entire range to get the appropriate slope from the firing line to the berm and have a new drainage line installed through the berm to the pond on the other side.

While the public range is closed, shooters will use the 50 yardline range behind the clubhouse for daily operations. Some significant repairs to the wooden baffles will be made before we close the public range and open the 50 yard line range for daily use. Once the public range is repaired (possibly 4-8 weeks after closing) we will shift operations back to the public range.

A couple of things bear mentioning from range safety:

RSOs are being reminded to inspect the white "eyebrows" on the wooden baffles every cease fire. We still have the occasional shooter who fires a new rifle (particularly AR platforms) without first bore sighting the rifle. Frequently there is a tight group of 10-15 rounds in the eyebrow. The other issue is on the pistol side when a new pistol shooter brings a new pistol to the range and has not quite got the concept of sight alignment and sight picture and puts numerous stray rounds into the white eyebrows, into the grass in front of the firing line or an adjacent target. Again, if you happen to notice a shooter who has an issue keeping THEIR rounds on THEIR target, please let the RSO know. The damage to the infrastructure eventually will cost the club money to repair. As members, that is OUR money.

Finally, as your CRSO please feel free to reach out to me if you have any safety concerns about the range. We are here to make your shooting experience as good and as safe as possible. Also, we are always looking for good people to become Range Safety Officers. If you've been a member for a year or more and would like to be considered for a position as a Range Safety Officer please contact me.

Updates from Buildings & Grounds Team -

Our year is about to end and we can see the many positive changes to our club. Now is a good time to see what is coming soon.

First is the grading of the 100 yard area of the public range early in 2024. This will level the 100 yard range and slope it to a new drainage area with a 12 inch drain pipe. It also builds up the 100 yard berm with 80 truck loads of needed soil which includes needed soil behind the pistol bullet catcher.

Second is the complete replacement of the baffles on the 50 yard range, removal of the railroad ties, and a realignment of all shooting positions. All the work on all our ranges will result in a safer range and with shooting stand holders at ground level (no more sandbags).

Last, we are lucky to have Keena Meyer on our board. She will begin working at making our range more inviting by doing additional needed landscaping and plantings. She, like all of us, also wants to work at having more female shooters, members, and RSO's.

The next year again is exciting as we all work together making our club a safer and inviting place to exercise our Second Amendment Rights.

The Dade City Precision Rifle Team starts all team members on shooting progression through the NRA's Marksmanship Qualification Program (https://mqp.nra.org/)

The highest level in this program - a level at which we feel the shooter is ready for state level competition is the Distinguished Expert level. Since our inception we have had three participants reach bench rest DE level - **Emily Lanning**, **Hannah Lanning**, and **Jake Burns**. The Lanning sisters also cinched DE while shooting from a standing position prior to moving out of Florida.

We have 6 experts and 6 sharpshooters on the team as well. A complete list of names and achievement level is posted on the Team bulletin board at the clubhouse.
